Father Kevin came to the hospital over the course of the week to speak to us and get to know our family. Andrew sadly died and Father Kevin did the funeral service. After this Father Kevin would call round to our house regularly just catch up see how all the family were and how we were coping and he would always make a point of talking with us after church service on Sunday. He was such a lovely, genuine, caring man who offered us such support throughout a time of grief.
